## Job description

### **Key details**

#### Job outline

This postholder will be an organised and flexible individual who is committed to supporting sexual health amongst young people living in Wandsworth, Richmond, Merton, Kingston (collectively known as "South West London"). You are able to balance process and programme management with relationship building and maintenance. You will manage the South West London Part-Time Outreach and Support Worker, and be responsible for any volunteers.

#### Programme

METRO work closely with our partner Spectra to deliver sexual health services in the London Boroughs of Wandsworth, Richmond, Merton, Kingston (South West London). In these Boroughs, METRO deliver the Come Correct free condom scheme (C-card), the National Chlamydia Screening Programme (NCSP) as well as Get It, an online scheme which offers condoms, lube, Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea screens.

METRO also delivers training and education, aimed at both young people and professionals working with young people, as well as community outreach and engagement to reach young people directly- particularly those who are most vulnerable to sexual ill health.

Our South West London services are supported by a sexual health office, and is linked to a team of sexual health workers who deliver similar sexual health services in different boroughs and counties.

#### Role

You will be able to work across multiple geographic areas in London with select venues, supporting them to deliver the NCSP and free condom schemes and providing sexual health training and education as relevant. You will visit settings such as pharmacies, GPs, youth groups, colleges, universities, and attend local events to ensure services are delivered consistently and to a high standard, and to demonstrate how to engage young people around sexual health in a variety of contexts and situations. You will lead and deliver sexual health outreach to young people, such as during fresher's fairs people. You will provide focused support to vulnerable young people in conjunction with a number of services, including local authority Looked After Children, Care leavers, people with SEND, Youth Offending Service and CAMHS (Child Adolescent Mental Health Services).

You will manage the Support Worker, be responsible for their induction and supervisions, and setting their workplan and priorities. You will have a key focus on upskilling your staff around sexual health, safeguarding and child protection.

You will act as the primary liaison between METRO and selected primary care services in South West London, establishing and maintaining relationships with GP practices and pharmacies through regular contact and visits. In addition, you will establish relationships and support process development within existing community organisations, education establishments, and youth services, including providing training. You will monitor individual site outcomes and conduct performance evaluations, ensuring wide spread coverage and increased accessibility.

You will remain up to date on local service offers and sexual health information. You will be able to respond appropriately to queries from young people and adults alike, promoting good practice at all times. In order to do this, you will understand key issues relating to contraception, sexually transmitted infections, HIV, and issues relating to consent and Child Sexual Exploitation. You will be able to talk about these issues in a friendly, appropriate, and non-judgmental way.

You will be able to support our busy sexual health office (SHO) with phone support and results administration as needed. You will support the day-to-day running of the team, including outreach and staffing rotas, order distribution to sites.

Working closely with the London Sexual Health Services Manager, you will monitor budgets, produce reports and ensure that all quarterly targets are achieved across the South West London contract.

#### **Main tasks**

- I. Support services to deliver the National Chlamydia Screening Programme for young people in Wandsworth, Richmond, Kingston and Merton by ensuring stock is maintained, key information is transmitted, and any issues are addressed swiftly.
- 2. Support services to deliver the free condom schemes for young people in Wandsworth, Richmond and Kingston by ensuring stock is maintained, key information is transmitted, and any issues are addressed swiftly.
- 3. Feedback regularly to sites around performance outcomes and potential enhancements, to support all sites to meet targets overall and to improve the service they offer.

- 4. Promote and increase engagement with the Get it free online condom and Chlamydia screening offer, developing social media content where needed
- 5. Deliver sexual health training to stakeholders (e.g. CRASH Contraception Reproductive Sexual Health) and professionals in a variety of venues, online and in-person and ensuring that local services and targets are promoted.
- Support venues to disseminate sexual health, contraception, and STI prevention information to all services users, ensuring at all times that services are delivered consistently and to a high standard.
- 7. Conducting research to gather evidence to inform service delivery, including scoping studies of the needs of young people, getting regular feedback from young people on our approach, branding etc.
- 8. Identify new venues for sexual health work, liaising with key stakeholders and partners to support ongoing relationships and to develop new ones. Developments should take into consideration geographic need as well as suitability.
- 9. Provide regular weekly support to the Sexual Health Office, taking calls from clients, delivering results and making onward referrals.
- 10. Complete quarterly, annual, and ad hoc reports on targets, outcomes, activity, and challenges.
- 11. Understand the importance of informed consent relating to testing and to ensure that it is applied at all times, and to adhere to the Fraser Guidelines and Child Sex Exploitation (CSE) when working with Under 16s and vulnerable adults.
- 12. Keep up to date with developments occurring within the sexual health, contraception, especially among young people and those most at risk.
- 13. Work with the sexual health office to ensure all online orders are fulfilled
- 14. Attend quarterly Come Correct and other relevant meetings with external partners as required.
- 15. Line manage and provide regular supervision and career and personal development activities with the Support Worker, providing or sourcing training as needed

#### Other duties

- I. Adhere to METRO policies and procedures at all times.
- 2. In line with METRO's policy on Information Governance (IG), confidentiality and data handling, you will be expected to undertake, pass and maintain the required IG modules as indicated by your line manager.
- Ensure sensitive and confidential recording and handling of information in accordance with the Data Protection Act, GDPR regulations and METRO's Information Governance policies.
- In line with METRO's policy on Safeguarding, you will be expected to undertake, pass and maintain the required Safeguarding Training modules as indicated by your line manager.
- 5. Attend regular supervision, and to undertake appropriate training as agreed. Maintain and update knowledge, skills and undertake continuing education in accordance with personal and service needs within a framework of a personal development plan.

6. Undertake any other appropriate duties as requested by your manager. If these duties are extensive and of a higher job description scale, the terms and conditions of the post may be varied in negotiation with your line manager.
