

Youth Volunteer Role Description

Overview:

METRO Youth are a diverse team of people that deliver a range of services for young people across South London and the South East of England. We run weekly youth groups for young people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and who may be questioning their sexuality or gender identity (LGBTQ). Those groups are delivered through a team of staff and volunteers. These groups are most importantly a safe space for young LGBTQ people to be themselves, meet other young LGBTQ people, explore their feelings with the support of peers and group leaders as well as learn vital knowledge and skills. Youth group sessions vary from sharing coming out experiences and advice, running an LGBTQ-themed film night and doing relationships and sex education. METRO also hold events throughout the year for the groups, as well as attending national events such as London PRIDE, Trans Pride in Brighton, UK Black Pride and local Prides in Croydon and Margate.

As a METRO Youth Volunteer, you would be an integral member of the youth team in supporting the Lead and Support Workers in the delivery of the weekly groups. These are held in 7 London boroughs and Medway. You would be responsible for tasks such as setting up the space and activities, chatting with young people and supporting the facilitation of activities. Your support would enable the lead worker to provide more one to one support as necessary and help in the overall management of some very vibrant groups as well as supporting future advertising and promotion to encourage more participants for some of the quieter groups.

The time required for this volunteering opportunity is:

Approximately 3 hrs per group of an evening

Initial training commitment:

Initially there will be a days training with skilled members of staff and the Head of Youth Domain. This will include topics such as safeguarding, confidentiality, boundaries, Fraser Guidelines, and techniques in delivering groups and managing difficult behaviour.

You will undertake and/or assist in the following duties:

- Welcome young people to the group
- Setting up and clearing up spaces and equipment

- Support particularly shy individuals
- Support the workers in managing the group activities
- Be an active member of the discussions and contribute to activities
- Support with recording attendees to the group
- Support with the promotion of the group
- Participate in Youth Team meetings as able
- Attend supervision with line manager
- Support with the preparation and delivery of events throughout the year
- Assist in the development of Youth resources
- Work within METRO's principals and frameworks
- Adhere to an promote METRO's Equality Opportunities policy
- Adhere and work to METRO's agreed policies regarding confidentiality, operational policies, safeguarding and information governance
